KAT HOLMES - Epée

Birthday: July 15th, 1993


Birthplace: Washington, D.C.

College: Princeton University, BA in Neuroscience '17.

2016 Olympian. 2015 Pan Am Games gold medalist, individual and team. 2019 Pan Am Games individual champion and team gold medalist.

Four-time NCAA All-American (2012, 2013, 2014, 2017). Anchor of winning US women's épée team at 2018 senior World Championships. Six-time member of Senior World Championship teams (2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019).

Tokyo will be Kat's second Olympic Games (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). After returning from Tokyo, she will attend medical school at Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City. Kat's senior thesis in neuroscience at Princeton was titled "How Risk Preference and Perception of Action Riskiness in Fencing Affect Learning and Strategy of Fencing Play."



COURTNEY HURLEY - Epée

Birthday: September 30th, 1990

Birthplace: Houston, TX

College: University of Notre Dame, BA in Film, Television and Theater '13.

Three-time Olympian (London 2012; Rio 2016, Tokyo 2020). A member of first US women's épée team to secure an Olympic medal, claiming the team bronze in 2012. In 2018, at the Senior World Championships, Courtney became the first US woman to win an épée medal in that tournament, claiming the team gold and individual bronze. A member of every Senior World Championships team since the age of 15. Two-time Pan Am Games team member (2007; 2011 - team gold, individual silver). Four-time NCAA First-Team All-American at Notre Dame. Two-time NCAA national champion (2011, 2013). Five-time USFA Division I national champion (2007, 2008, 2010, 2011, 2012).

Tokyo will be Courtney's third Olympic Games (2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). Her sister, Kelley Hurley, is also an elite NYAC fencer and was a member of the bronze medal-winning épée team in 2012. Courtney and Kelley have been coached by their father, Bob, since childhood. Courtney is planning on taking a long road trip in her camper van following these Games.



KELLEY HURLEY - Epée

College: Notre Dame, BA Art/Pre-Med '10

Four-time Olympian (Beijing 2008; London 2012; Rio 2016; Tokyo 2020). With her sister Courtney, a

member of first US women's épée team to secure an Olympic medal, claiming the team bronze in 2012. Four-time NCAA women's épée champion. Gold medal, team competition, 2018 senior World Championships. Member of 14 senior World Championships teams from 2003-2019. Five-time USFA Division I national champion (2004, 2006, 2013, 2015, 2017). 2008 USFA Division I national champion. Two-time member of Pan Am Games teams (2007; 2011- team gold, individual gold). *Tokyo will be Kelley's fourth Olympic Games (2008 Beijing, 2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She and her sister, Courtney, were members of the first US women's épée team to secure a medal in the Olympics (London 2012, bronze). Kelley was the only US female épée fencer to qualify for the 2008 Beijing Games.*

NICOLE ROSS - Foil

Birthplace: New York, NY

College: Columbia University, BA in Art History '13 London 2012 Olympian. 2010 NCAA Division I women's foil champion. Gold medal, team competition, 2018 senior World Championships. Member of nine senior World Championships teams. 2019



Pan Am Games team gold medalist. 2010 USFA Division I national champion. 2008 Ivy League Heptagonal champion. *Tokyo will be Nicole's second Olympic Games (2012 London, 2020 Tokyo). She was inspired to learn how to fence after watching the movie, "The Princess Bride." Nicole served as an assistant coach at Cornell University from 2016-2018.*

JAKE HOYLE - Epée

Birthplace: New York, NY

College: Columbia University, BA in Economics/Business Management '16



2019 USFA Division I national champion. Two-time NCAA men's épée champion (2015, 2016). Two-time NCAA All-American (2015, 2016). Two-time member of senior World Championship teams (2018, 2019).

Member of 2019 US Pan Am Games team. *Tokyo will be Jake's first Olympics. He was introduced to the sport of fencing in his school's cafeteria during an extra-curricular program.*

Eight-time world championships competitor (2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019). Two-time bronze medalist at Pan American Games (2011, 2015). Four-time silver medalist at Pan American Championships (2015, 2018, 2019, 2021). Three-time bronze medalist at Pan American Championships (2011, 2016, 2017). *Tokyo will be Angelica's second Olympic Games (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She was introduced to judo at the age of nine by her father, a former member of the Cuban national judo team. She competed in judo while attending John A. Ferguson Senior High School in Miami, FL before enrolling at Florida International University, also in Miami, FL. She is presently coached by the renowned Jhonny Prado.*

COLTON BROWN - -90kg

Birthday: October 8th, 1991

Hometown: Piscataway, NJ

College: San Jose State University, Bachelor's in Business Marketing '15

2016 Olympian. Five-time world championships competitor (2013, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019). Two-time Pan Am Championships silver medalist (2016, 2017). Bronze medalist 2018 Pan American Championships.

Tokyo will be Colton's second Olympics (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). He was introduced to the sport at the age of seven by his father, a black belt. At Piscataway High School, Colton also wrestled and played football. He gained inspiration to compete at the highest level by watching the NYAC's Jimmy Pedro secure a bronze medal at the 2004 Athens Games. (Pedro also won a bronze medal in 1996). Pedro later became Colton's coach. Recently, Colton began practicing Brazilian Jiu Jitsu.

Six-time US champion. Silver medalist, 2019 Pan Am Games. Alternate for 2016 Rio Games.

Tokyo will be Samantha's first Olympic Games. She began competing in the modern pentathlon in 2010. She lives and trains at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, CO. In 2017, Samantha joined the Army as part of the US Army World Class Athlete Program.



AMRO ELGEZIRY

Birthday: November 28th, 1986

Birthplace: Cairo, Egypt

College: Ain Shams University (Egypt)

Four-time Olympian (Beijing 2008, London 2012, Rio 2016, Tokyo

2020). 2016 World Championships team gold medalist. 2019 US champion.

Tokyo will be Amro's fourth Olympics (2008 Beijing, 2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo), his first representing the USA.

Previously he had competed for Egypt. Amro is married to Isabella Isaksen, NYAC modern pentathlete Olympian in 2016. His brothers, Omar and Emad, competed for Egypt in the modern pentathlon in the 2016 and 2000 Games, respectively. Amro began competing in the modern pentathlon in 2001, following Emad's performance at the 2000 Sydney Games. In 2017, Amro joined the US Army as part of the US Army World Class Athlete Program in Colorado Springs, CO.

CHARLOTTE BUCK - Eight (8+)

Birthday: February 15th, 1995

Hometown: Nyack, NY

College: Columbia University, Bachelor's in Biology '18

2018 World University Championships bronze medalist US 8+, 2020 New Zealand champion 4x (quad); 2017, US champion senior pair, four with coxswain, and eight.

Tokyo will be Charlotte's first Olympic Games, not to mention her first national team. She began rowing as a senior at Nyack High School in New York and walked onto the rowing team as a freshman at Columbia. During her senior year at Columbia, she served as the team captain and was named MVP.




KENDALL CHASE - Four (4-)

Birthday: August 25th, 1994

Birthplace: San Francisco, CA

College: University of California, Bachelor's in Multi/Interdisciplinary Studies: Health and Illness '16 Fourth in the eight at 2017 World Championships, seven-time national team member (junior, 2011-2012; under 23, 2014-2014; senior, 2017); first varsity eight 2013 NCAA Championships, second varsity eight 2015 NCAA Championships.



Tokyo will be Kendall's first Olympic Games. She grew up in Evergreen, CO. She was named a 2015 Sportswoman of Colorado and, in the same year, the PAC-12 Women's Rowing Athlete of the Year. She presently serves as a Referee Programs Assistant for USRowing in Princeton, NJ.

OLIVIA COFFEY - Eight (8+)

College: Harvard University, Bachelor's in Computer Science and Economics '11, University of Cambridge, Master's of Business Administration in Finance '18.



Gold medal eight 2018 World Championships, bronze medal eight 2019 World Championships, nine-time US team member (under 23, 2009-2011; senior, 2013-15; 2018-19). *Tokyo will be Olivia's first Olympics. Her father, Calvin, stroked the US men's pair to a silver medal at the 1976 Olympics. Olivia attended Phillips Academy Andover before rowing at Harvard. She works as a consultant at One Equity Partners.*

TRACY EISSE - Pair (2-)

Birthday: November 20th, 1989

Birthplace: Summit, NJ

College: Cornell University, Bachelor's in Sociology and French '12

Fifth quadruple sculls 2016 Rio Games, gold medal quadruple sculls 2015 World Rowing Championships, gold medal eight 2018 World Championships, silver medal pair 2017 World Championships, bronze medal quadruple sculls 2014 World Championships, fourth pair 2019 World Championships, seven-time national team member (senior 2014-15, 2017-19). *Tokyo will be Tracy's second Olympics (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She grew up in Fair Lawn, NJ and attended Fair Lawn HS before going to Cornell. At Cornell, Tracy walked on to the rowing team as a freshman in the fall of 2008.*

**KATELIN GUREGIAN - Eight (8+)**

College: University of Washington, Bachelor's in History '09

Gold medalist women's eight 2016 Rio Olympic Games, five-time world champion women's eight (2009, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2018), bronze medal women's eight 2019 World Rowing Championships, fourth place women's eight 2017 World Rowing Championships, 12-time national team member (under 23, 2006-08; senior, 2009, 2013-15, 2017-19). *Tokyo will be Katelin's second Olympic Games (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She and Meghan Musnicki are the only returning members of the winning 2016 women's eight. Her husband is fellow 2016 Olympian, Nareg Guregian.*

**MEGAN KALMOE - Pair (2-)**

Birthday: August 21st, 1983

Hometown: St. Croix Falls, WI

College: University of Washington, Bachelor's in Latin and English '06

Four-time Olympian (2008, 2012, 2016, 2020), bronze medalist quadruple sculls 2012 London,



fifth double sculls 2008 Beijing, fifth quadruple sculls 2016 Rio, 1st quad sculls 2015 World Championships, second in the pair 2014 and 2017 World Championships, second in quad sculls 2011 World Championships, fourth in pair 2019 World Championships, fifth quad sculls at 2010 and 2013 World Championships, 13-time national team member (Under 23, 2005; Senior 2009-11, 2013-15, 2017, 2019). *Tokyo will be Megan's fourth Olympics (2008 Beijing, 2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). Her bronze medal in the quad in 2012 was the first in history for a US team in that event. Following the Tokyo Games, she is planning to retire from competitive rowing and will live in San Diego, CA. Megan was named 2014 and 2015 USRowing Athlete of the year. She began rowing as a sophomore walk-on at the University of Washington in the autumn of 2002.*

GRACE LUCZAK - Four (4-)

Birthplace: Royal Oak, MI

College: Stanford University, Bachelor's in Human Biology '11

Three-time World Championships gold medalist in the eight (2013, 2014, 2015), world record holder in W8+ (set in Switzerland 2013), 11-time national team member (junior, 2007; under 23, 2009-11; senior, 2009-10, 2013-15); two-time Olympian (2016, 2020).

Tokyo will be Grace's second Olympic Games (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She placed 4th in the women's pair in Rio. At Stanford, she was a member of the winning squad at the 2009 NCAA Championships. She works at Ernst and Young in marketing and at Hydrow, a rowing machine start-up, as a rowing instructor.

**MEGHAN MUSNICKI - Eight (8+)**

Birthday: February 5th, 1983

Hometown: Naples, NY

College: Ithaca College, Bachelor's in Psychology '05

Two-time Olympic gold medalist eight 2012 London and 2016 Rio, gold medalist eight 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2015 World Championships, third in eight at 2019 World Championships, fourth in pair at 2013 World Championships, nine-time national team member (senior, 2010-11, 2013-15, 2009).

Tokyo will be Meghan's third Olympic Games (2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She and the NYAC's Katelin Guregian are the only rowers returning from the winning 2016 women's eight. She is a certified personal trainer and an Associate Coach at Valor Performance.

**KRISTINE O'BRIEN - Eight (8+)**

Birthday: October 3rd, 1991

Hometown: Massapequa Park, NY

College: University of Virginia, Bachelor's in Sociology and Anthropology '13

Gold medal eight 2018 World Championships, bronze medal eight 2019 World Championships,





gold medal four 2015 World Championships, silver medal four 2016 World Championships, fourth place four 2017 World Championships, 10-time national team member (junior; 2009; under 23, 2011-13; senior 2015-19), gold medal varsity eight and team title 2012 NCAA Championships. *Tokyo will be Kristine's first Olympic Games. She was the 2010 ACC Freshman of the Year while at the University of Virginia. From 2016-2017, she served as the Assistant Rowing Coach at her alma mater.*

MEGHAN O'LEARY - Quad Sculls (4x)

Birthday: August 24th, 1984

Birthplace: Tulsa, Oklahoma

College: University of Virginia, Bachelor's in Religious Studies, Sociology '07, Master's in Education in Social Foundations, Leadership and Policy '08
Second double sculls 2017 World Championships, third double sculls 2018 World Championships, sixth double sculls 2016 Rio Games, sixth double sculls 2014 World Championships, seventh double sculls 2013 World Championships, seven-time national team member (senior, 2013-15, 2017-18). *Tokyo will be Meghan's second Olympics (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She competed in softball and volleyball at the University of Virginia and only began rowing post-college, after a five-year stint at ESPN in production and programming. She is a member of the Board of Directors of USRowing.*



ELLEN TOMEK - Quad Sculls (4x)

Birthday: May 1st, 1984

Birthplace: Flint, Michigan

College: University of Michigan, Bachelor's in Economics '06

Three-time Olympian (Beijing 2008, Rio 2016, Tokyo 2020), eleven-time national team member (under-23, 2006; Senior, 2007, 2009, 2013-15, 2017-18); second double sculls 2017 World Championships, 3rd double sculls 2018 World Championships. *Although Tokyo will be Ellen's third Olympics, this will be the first Olympics in which she competes in the quad sculls. She finished fifth in the double sculls at the 2008 Beijing Games and 6th in the double sculls at the 2016 Rio Games. In her spare time, she works as a personal rowing and fitness coach.*



SWIMMING

CATIE DeLOOF - 4x100m Freestyle Relay

Birthday: February 12th, 1997

Hometown: Grosse Pointe, MI

College: University of Michigan, Bachelor's in Sociology '19

Nine-time CSCAA All-American. Gold medal, 4x100m freestyle relay, 2019 World University Games. Five-time Big 10 champion (2018 - 4x100yds freestyle relay, 4x200yds freestyle Relay; 2019 - 800- 4x200yds freestyle relay, 4x50yds free-



style relay, 4x100yds freestyle relay). *Tokyo will be Catie's first Olympics. Her older sisters, Ali DeLoof and Gabby DeLoof, fellow NYAC swimmers, also swam at the University of Michigan. Catie swam at the 2016 US Trials in the 100m BK and 50m FS. She is the 17th female swimmer or diver from the University of Michigan to make an Olympic team.*

AMINI FONUA (Tonga) - 100m Breaststroke

Birthday: December 14th, 1989

Hometown: Ponsonby, New Zealand

College: Texas A&M University, Bachelor's in Telecommunications and Multimedia Studies '13
Two-time 50m breaststroke champion, Oceania Swimming Championships (2010, 2012). Winner 50m breaststroke, 100m breaststroke and 200m breaststroke, 2015 Pacific Games. Winner 100yds breaststroke, 4x50yds medley relay at 2012 Big 12 Championships. Six-time NCAA Division I All-American.



Tokyo will be Amini's third Olympics (2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). He competes for the Kingdom of Tonga and carried the Tongan flag in the Opening Ceremony of the 2012 London Games. Amini works as marketing manager for the House of Tonga Hotel, which his parents opened in Nuku'alofa, Tonga in 2016. He resides in New York City.

BRETT FRASER (Cayman Islands) - 50m Freestyle, 100m Freestyle

Birthday: August 28th, 1989

Hometown: George Town, Cayman Islands

College: University of Florida, '11

Winner 200m freestyle at 2011 Pan Am Games.



Silver medal, 200m freestyle and 200m backstroke at 2010 Central American and Caribbean Games. Winner 200m freestyle and 4x200yds freestyle relay at 2011 NCAA Division I Championships; 19-time NCAA Division I All-American. *Tokyo will be Brett's third Olympic Games (2008 Beijing, 2012 London, 2020 Tokyo). He competes for the Cayman Islands and carried the Cayman flag in the Opening Ceremony of the 2012 London Games. He works at Fraser Properties Cayman, a real estate brokerage founded by his father in George Town, Grand Cayman.*

TRACK AND FIELD

VALARIE ALLMAN - Discus

Birthday: February 23rd, 1995

Hometown: Longmont, CO

College: Stanford University, Bachelor's in Product Design '17

US champion, 2018. Seventh place, 2019 world championships. Seven-time All-American at Stanford University. Winner, 2021 US Olympic Trials, Eugene, OR. *Tokyo will be Valarie's first Olympic Games. In 2020, she set the American record, of 70.15m/230' 2". Valarie currently trains under Coach Zebulon Sion of the University of Texas and lives in Austin, TX. Prior to beginning track and field as a freshman in high school, she was a competitive dancer.*



GWEN BERRY - Hammer Throw

Birthday: June 29th, 1989

Hometown: St. Louis, MO

College: Southern Illinois University, Bachelor's in Psychology/Criminal Justice '11

US champion 2017, two-time silver medalist US championships (2018, 2019). Three-time US indoor weight throw champion (2013, 2014, 2016).

Tokyo will be Gwen's second Olympic Games (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She holds a personal best of 77.78m (255-2), from June 2018. She holds the world record in the weight throw of 25.60m (83-11 3/4"), which she set in March 2017. Gwen was an alternate for the 2012 London Games. While attending McCluer High School in Florissant, MO, Gwen played basketball primarily, participating in track and field in the off-season.



ERICA BOUGARD - Heptathlon

Birthday: July 26th, 1993

Hometown: Byhalia, MI

College: Mississippi State University, '16

Two-time US champion (2019, 2018), second place

2017 US championships, second place 2016

NCAA Championships. Indoors: two-time US pentathlon champion (2018, 2017), second pentathlon

at 2014 US Indoor Championships, pentathlon champion 2013 NCAA Indoor Championships, second in pentathlon at 2015 NCAA Indoor Championships, US long jump champion (2017), third place US Olympic Trials 2021. Contested the World Championships in 2013, 2015, 2017 and 2019 with a highest placing of fourth (2019). Placed fifth in the pentathlon at the World Indoor Championships of 2018.

Tokyo will be Erica's first Olympic Games. In high school, she competed in track and field and played on the basketball team. During her 2015 outdoor season at Mississippi State, she was named to the Bowerman Trophy Watch List. (The Bowerman Trophy is awarded annually to the nation's finest American collegiate track and field athlete).



NADIA EKE (Ghana) - Triple Jump

Birthday: January 11th, 1993

Birthplace: Accra, Ghana

College: Columbia University, Bachelor's in Psychology '15

Ghanaian record holder - 14.33m/47' 0 1/4", set in June 2019. 2016 African champion. Four-time NCAA All-American. Ten-time Ivy League Heptagonal champion in long and triple jumps.

Tokyo will be Nadia's first Olympic Games. She moved to Worcester, MA from Ghana when she was 12 years old and discovered the triple jump in seventh grade. She served as an assistant coach at her alma mater, Columbia University, during the 2015-2016 season before taking on an assistant coaching position at New York University. In April 2020, Nadia launched her own company, Axxelerate, which focuses on professional athlete career enrichment. Her surname is pronounced "EE-kay."



TORI FRANKLIN - Triple Jump

Birthday: October 7th, 1992

Hometown: Evanston, IL

College: Michigan State University, Bachelor's in Multi/Interdisciplinary



Studies '15, Master's in Business Administration '21

American record-holder both indoors (14.57m/47' 0 3/4", set in February, 2019) and outdoors (14.84m/48' 8 1/4", set in May, 2018). Eighth place, 2018 Indoor World Athletics Championships. Three-time silver medalist, US championships (2017, 2018, 2019). Two-time US indoor champion (2017, 2018). Two-time runner up US indoor championships (2016, 2019).

Silver medalist, 2021 Olympic Trials, Eugene, OR. *Tokyo will be Tori's first Olympics. She began participating in track and field in sixth grade, and excelled in track and field and basketball. She is a frequent contributor on Medium, an online publishing platform and speaks publicly about mental health.*




AISHA PRAUGHT-LEER (Jamaica) - 1500m

Commonwealth 3000m steeplechase champion 2018, 1500m silver medalist 2019 Pan Am Games, holder of Jamaican records at 1500m, 3000m, 5000m and 3000m steeplechase. *Tokyo will be Aisha's second Olympics (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). She will represent Jamaica, as she did in 2016. She is married to fellow 1500m specialist, Will Leer. The middle-distance couple live and train in Crested Butte, CO.*



DEANNA PRICE - Hammer Throw

Birthday: June 8th, 1993

Hometown: Moscow Mills, MO

College: Southern Illinois University, Bachelor's in Accounting '16

World champion 2019, US record-holder (80.31m/263' 6"), eighth place 2016 Rio Games, two-time NCAA champion (2015, 2016). *Tokyo will be Deanna's second Olympic Games (2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). Her 80.31m throw in winning the Olympic Trials makes her the second longest thrower of all time. In high school, Deanna was an accomplished softball player and threw both the discus and the shot. Her remarkable athletic success comes despite having only one kidney. She is coached by her husband, James Lambert.*



KATIE NAGEOTTE - Pole Vault

Birthday: June 13th, 1991

Hometown: Olmsted Falls, OH

College: Ashland University, '13

US indoor champion 2018, 2019, silver medal 2019 Pan Am Games, winner 2013 NCAA Division II Indoor and Outdoor Championships. Seventh place finish 2019 World Championships.

Winner Olympic Trials 2021. *Tokyo will be Katie's first Olympics. In high school, she pole vaulted, dived and golfed at a varsity level. She attended the University of Dayton for two years before transferring to Ashland University, where she was a three-time All-American.*





KARA WINGER - Javelin Throw

Birthday: April 10th, 1986

Hometown: Vancouver, WA

College: Purdue University, Bachelor's in Nutrition, Fitness and Health '09, DeVry University, Master's in Accounting '16
Eight-time US champion (2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018), fifth

2019 World Championships, second 2021 US Olympic Trials.

Tokyo will be Kara's fourth Olympic Games (2008 Beijing, 2012 London, 2016 Rio, 2020 Tokyo). From June 2010 to May 2021, she held the American record of 66.67m/218'8". (The new record was set by Maggie Malone, who won the US Trials). She is married to Russell Winger, a discus and shot put specialist. Kara achieved her Master's in Accounting at DeVry University through a United States Olympic Committee scholarship program.



WILL CLAYE - Triple Jump

Birthday: June 13th, 1991

Hometown: Tucson, AZ

College: University of Florida, Bachelor's in Entrepreneurship '12

Two-time Olympic silver medalist (2012, 2016).

Two-time world indoor champion (2018, 2012).




